

The World's Playlist

You know what you like and enjoy in music, but when it comes to the world, what is the rest of the globe listening to? Outside of the United States, it's a lot more difficult to guess what the most popular songs are. Pop culture usually keeps people in the loop with what's being played on the radio on repeat and what's being aired on television. In that fact, it's surprising genres like K-POP and Latin are so popular within the United States.

What is apparent in each of these songs is the way the beat goes. Oddly enough, when searching through the popular genres, some songs were categorized under *several* genres. R&B, Rap, and Pop seemed to go with one another the most. "Rockstar" and "Young Dumb & Broke" were also considered as Rap and R&B.
